Stephen Creyke, 84 of Saint Michaels, MD died at HeartFields Assisted Living at Easton on April 30, 2025.

Steve was born in Washington, DC on March 20, 1941, the son of Geoffrey Creyke and Blanche Virginia (Mahurin) Creyke. He attended Bethesda Chevy Chase High School, followed by a BA in Fine Arts from Carnegie Mellon University and a JD from The George Washington University. Steve worked as a general practice attorney in Bethesda, MD until his retirement in 2011. He worked in the Montgomery County States Attorney's Office early in his career, he partnered with his life-long friend John Durfee for many years, was well regarded in the legal and business community, and was active in his local Rotary Club. He and his wife, Susan moved from Chevy Chase, MD to Saint Michaels, MD in 2011.

Steve was a devoted husband who enjoyed spending time with his wife, his family and friends, and his beloved chocolate Labrador, Charlotte. He and Susan enjoyed taking regular trips to Charleston, SC and Williamsburg, VA. Steve loved the classics, in music, literature, and art. In his free time, he sketched and painted with watercolors, continued to learn about the Civil War and WWII, built wooden ship models, took pride in maintaining his home, and enjoyed eating a sweet treat at least once a day.

He is survived by his wife of 34 years, Susan (Baird) Creyke, sons John and David, daughter Abigail Carpenter, grandsons Robert, Geoffrey, and Alexander, and sister Peg Callihan (Bernard Pobiak).
