Born October 7, 1921 in Coffeerville, MS, to H. Fred Rounsaville and Lou Ella Cook, Studie E. Knortz died on April 13, 2017, in Easton, MD. Studie lived a full and independent life up until a recent fall. She passed from complications related to the injuries.
