Sylvia Pennington Geib, 89, of Bamberg, SC, and formerly of Homestead, FL, died on March 16, 2017, at her residence.

Sylvia was born on February 3, 1928, in Poolesville, MD, the eldest child of the late Osma M. Pennington and Samantha Phillips Pennington. She graduated from Annapolis High School in 1945.
