Sylvia Scott Vinnicombe died peacefully at her home in Oxford, MD, on October 27, 2005. She was 83.

Sylvia Alexandra Tarvid was born in Cicero, IL, the daughter of Lithuanian immigrant parents. She moved to Baltimore in 1943 to work in the legal department of the old Glenn L. Martin Co. aircraft plant in Middle River. For 17 years she worked for WMAR TV in Baltimore as the host of the Woman's Angle talk show. Her guests included such stars as Robert Goulet, Maureen O'Hara, Charlton Heston, Jackie Gleason, Dean Martin, Andy Griffith, and many famous stars of the 50's. "She was the Martha Stewart of the era" said one of her hospice nurses, "except she was truly a class act". She also starred on Dialing for Dollars before going to work for McCormick & Company, where she met her husband Edward J. Vinnicombe, the Director of Marketing. In 1971, she and her husband moved to Oxford, MD, to own and operate the Oxford Muse and Emporium. Movie stars and celebrities from around the globe would visit their friends who had left the high society of Baltimore for the sleepy town of Oxford.

Her husband of forty-nine years died on September 13, 1997.

Mrs. Vinnicombe is survived by Ms. Susan Vinnicombe, the daughter of her late husband; and Ms. Donna Hayes, who managed the Oxford Muse for

almost two decades.

A graveside service will be held on Tuesday, November 22, 2005, at 11:00 AM, at Oxford Cemetery, Oxford, MD. Rev. Rod Brown of the Church of The Holy Trinity will conduct the ceremony for family and friends.
