Teresa Margaret Marolla Hopkins passed away on April 6, 2026 at the Heartfields Assisted Living community in Easton, Maryland. She was 87 years old.

Terri was born on October 15, 1938 in Philadelphia, PA to Frank J. Marolla, Jr. and Catherine P. (“Pete”) Tatlow Marolla. She attended Melrose Academy (where she was captain of the field hockey team), Gwynedd Mercy College, and Beaver College (now Arcadia University), from which she received a Master of Education. Terri took tremendous pride in her 20+ year career as a classroom teacher, special education teacher, and reading specialist, and particularly in helping struggling young readers overcome their difficulties and learn to read.

Terri is survived by her husband Charles H. Hopkins, Sr., her son Charles (“Chip”) H. Hopkins, Jr. and his wife, Mary; her daughter Caroline Hopkins Semancik and her husband, Steve; her sister Constance (“Connie”) Lauffer; her grandchildren Nicholas and his wife Gina, Madeleine, and Christopher; her beautiful great-granddaughter and namesake, Teresa (“Reese”); her niece, Amanda Macomber, her husband Scott, and their children Nora and Nolin, all of whom were beloved by her and loved her dearly in return.

After retiring, Terri – a/k/a “Memom” to her grandchildren and “Terpy” to her

family – took the greatest pleasure in her role as grandmother, running “Camp Memom” over spring break at her beach house in St. Simons Island, GA and in the summertime at other vacation destinations. She also volunteered as a mentor to young people at her adopted home in Easton, MD and enjoyed activities with the Woman’s Club of St. Michaels. Terri was a talented artist, producing many beautiful watercolor paintings and knitted, crocheted, and needlepoint pieces that will be cherished by her family.

Terri’s idea of a perfect day was riding bikes to the beach, playing games there with her grandchildren, returning home to cook them pasta and seafood, and then enjoying it with them on the screened porch.
