Thomas A. Smith of Chestertown, MD, died on April 4, 2004, at Chester River Manor Nursing Center in Chestertown, MD. He was 77.

Born in Philadelphia, PA, on October 24, 1926, he was the son of the late George and Margaret McCormick Smith. He graduated from Southeast Catholic High School in Philadelphia, LaSalle University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Education and Temple University with a Master's of Education. On November 27, 1958, he married Peggy Glenn, and they resided in Northeast Philadelphia.

He served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict with the 19th Infantry 24th division; was wounded on March 9, 1951; and received a Purple Heart along with the Korean service medal with three bronze stars. He was honorably discharged in December of 1951. Upon his return to Philadelphia, Mr. Smith worked with Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company for five years. He then took a position as a mathematics teacher with the Germantown school system, from which he retired in the mid 1980's.

In Pennsylvania, he was a member of the Pennsylvania Yacht Club. He and his wife moved to Chestertown in 1997 where he was a devout member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Frank M. Jarman American Legion Post #36, and Great Oak Manor. He volunteered his time with Garnett Elementary

School. He also enjoyed sailing, playing golf, and doing yard work.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Smith is survived by two sisters, Margaret Walters of Philadelphia, PA, and Regina Sokol of Ft. Myers, FL, along with numerous nieces, nephews, grandnieces, grandnephews, great- grandnieces and great-grandnephews. He is also survived by one brother-in-law and three sisters-in-law.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be held on Tuesday, April 13, 2004, at 11 a.m. at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, High Street, in Chestertown.

Interment will be in Arlington National Cemetery.
