It is with deep sorrow that we announce the sudden passing of Thomas James Brown on Monday 11th November, 2024 at Washington Hospital Center.

He was born in Racine, Wisconsin on June 2nd, 1949. It seemed fitting that he passed away on Veterans Day, as he served his country well. His career lasted over 40 years, starting in the Air Force and then supporting the NSA's SIGINT mission with assignments in the U.S. and overseas. During this time he obtained his Bachelor's Degree in Business and Management.

He was a collector of musical instruments and could play every one of them. In later years his favorite pastime was playing pool in the APA League and finally achieving his dream goal of playing in the World Championships in Las Vegas.
