



Thomas E. Draper

August 1, 1945 - February 16, 2026

Thomas “Tom” E. Draper of Centreville, MD passed away on February 16, 2026, surrounded by his loving family. He was 80 years old.

Tom’s smile lit a room with joy, and he was known for the warmth, kindness, and quiet strength he shared freely with others. He lived a life defined by service—to his country, his community, his family, and the many friends who were fortunate to know him.

Born on August 1, 1945, Tom was the son of the late Frank W. Draper, Jr., and Ruth Willis Draper in Chestertown, MD. He graduated from Centreville High School in 1963 and earned his bachelor’s degree from the University of Maryland in 1967.

Following graduation, Tom enlisted in the U.S. Army. He completed the Infantry Officer Candidate Course and the Officer Candidate Tactical Officer Training Course and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in 1969. During his service, he saw combat in the Vietnam War. After three years of honorable service, he resigned his commission as a First Lieutenant. In recognition of his courage, sacrifice, and dedication, Tom was awarded the Purple Heart, the Combat Infantry Badge, a Bronze Star, and numerous other commendations.

After returning home, Tom dedicated many years to public service through a career with Maryland's Division of Parole and Probation. Upon retirement, he pursued a lifelong passion by founding Draper's Landscape Business. Combining his love of horticulture with a strong work ethic, Tom built a loyal clientele throughout Queen Anne's County and took great pride in the beauty he created for others.

Tom was deeply committed to his community and served as a Past Commander of the Jeff Davis Post #18 of the American Legion. A member of the Centreville Lions Club for 40 years, Tom served many roles from Lion Tamer to President. He was also involved in the Queen Anne's County Sportsman's Club cofounded by his father.

A passionate sportsman, Tom had a lifelong passion for the outdoors. He especially loved chasing rockfish, bird hunting, and fox hunting.

He is survived by his devoted wife of 50 years, Kathryn H. Draper, his sisters Julia D. Corder and Jane D. Everett; and many beloved nieces, nephews, and godchildren.

In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his siblings, Frank W. Draper III, Ann Draper Tikiob, John W. Draper, and Susan Draper Whaley.

Visitation will be held on Wednesday, February 25 from 5 p.m. – 7 p.m. at Fellows, Helfenbein, and Newnam Funeral Home, 408 South Liberty Street, Centreville, MD 21617. A memorial service will take place on February 26, at 11:00 a.m., at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, in Centreville. Interment will be at a later date.

“ I first met Tom Draper (soon to be "tommy" for close to 60 years as I became "Dickie.") in the late afternoon of June 3, 1968. I am sure of the date because that was the day we both enlisted in the Army for Officer Candidate School (OCS) At Ft. Holabird, in the SE corner of Baltimore. We were standing on Dundalk, Ave. waiting for a bus to the train station. From there we were headed to Ft. Dix, NJ for Basic and Advanced Infantry Training.

When we arrived at the Reception Center at Ft. Dix in the middle of the night we drifted apart. We did end up in the same training company, but in different platoons, so we didn't see much of each other. At the end of training cycle we were held over for a short while and then headed to Advanced Individual Training (AIT). There we were bunk mates (I had the lower) and stayed together the entire time, sharing what went on.

.Finishing in New Jersey, we were enroute to Georgia. Tom took his car and I rode with him. Upon arrival we were assigned to the same platoon and shared a two-man cubicle for 6+ months, trying to survive and get a commission as a Second Lieutenant. In addition to learning about leadership, the Army and the Infantry, we also acquired other skills. Tom became master of the floor polishing machine. He could raise a shine bright enough to shave in. Mine was more pedestrian. My squad was responsible for cleaning the shower/bathroom. I became the commode/urinal guy, cleaning them nights and mornings..

Tom's primary desires were to serve his country, do his enlistment period in the Army and go home. However, his natural leadership skills kept getting in his way. Upon receiving our commissions, I headed to Louisiana to a training company. Tom was among the few selected to stay at Ft. Benning as a Tactical officer and work with other OCS candidates. I headed to Viet Nam and an Infantry Platoon Leader in the 25th Infantry Division. Tom came after me and was in a battalion in the same division. However, we were never able to link up. One or the other of us were always in the field when the other showed up for a visit.

Upon the completion of his Viet Nam tour Tom again received an elite assignment, being selected as a member of the Old Guard at

Fr. Myer, VA and Arlington National Cemetery. There only a few problems. He hated spit and polish; he didn't want any involvement in ceremonial activities, just to serve his remaining few months and go home; and he wasn't tall enough (which actually insulted him). The officers in the unit were all at least 6' tall. So he stayed with my family in Arlington while it was sorted out and i saw him on weekends. He finally was assigned to ft. Holabird, where I was also stationed and where we had started. almost three years earlier. We served together on the Post Staff and socialized over the next four months until Tom "mustered out." He went home to Centreville. But we kept in touch and he was the best man at my wedding to my late wife Nancy the following September. And then we went our separate ways for a long time. Both of us being bad correspondents, we last contact over the years. Nancy and I and a growing brood of kids moved to Georgia (twice), Germany, Virginia, New Hampshire and, finally, back to Maryland. Meanwhile, Tom had stayed put settling deep into Centreville, meeting his lovely wife Kathy and enjoying Eastern Shore life. Our "reunion" years later was almost a fluke. On a whim when traveling through Centreville we stopped at the Draper Brothers' Liquor Store to see if Tom was one of the brothers. Turned out that he was, but not one of the store brothers. We got contact info and eventually picked where we had left off years before. After Nancy passed away Tom made a point of connecting with me and helping me work through my grief. later, when I remarried, my wife Fran had the pleasure of meeting Tom and Kathy and getting to experience the Eastern Shore. Tom Draper was a gentleman of the old school. I miss you brother RJM
