



Thomas Edward Robinson

December 30, 1943 - September 18, 2025

Thomas Edward Robinson, lovingly known as “Ed”, passed away peacefully on September 18, 2025, at Billings Clinic Hospital in Billings, Montana. He was 81.

Born on December 30, 1943, in Chestertown, Maryland, Ed grew up in Millington, where he spent nearly his entire life before relocating to Shell, Wyoming three years ago. He was the son of the late William Noland Robinson and Ruby Mae King Robinson and was predeceased by his brothers Gilbert, Alan, and Carville Robinson. He is survived by his sister, Betty Ann Thorpe.

On December 31, 1965, Ed married the love of his life, E. Lucille Robinson, at Kent Island United Methodist Church in Chester, Maryland. They met at a dance in the Grasonville Fire Hall — a moment of “love at first sight.” The couple joyfully danced together every anniversary in celebration of their life-long love and were just three months shy of celebrating 60 years of marriage.

Ed is survived by his children, Dawn Snyder (Larry) and Brooks Robinson; grandchildren Jeremy Pouska (Tara) and Shannon Brown (Lance); and great-grandchildren Michelle, Wyatt, Jace, Rhett, Annabelle, Emmett, Emily, Molly, and Caroline. He also leaves behind many beloved nieces and nephews.

Ed graduated from Galena High School and went on to serve in the United States Navy. After his military service, he earned an associate's degree in accounting from Goldey-Beacom College. He built a long and dedicated career, working at Chestertown Electric, Delmarva Power, and Kent County Roads — where he helped establish the department alongside Donny Usilton. He later served for many years as the Kent County Administrator, continuing his lifelong commitment to public service.

Ed dedicated much of his life to public service in Millington, proudly continuing a family tradition. His father, William Noland Robinson, also served as Mayor of Millington for several years, helping to shape the town's leadership in earlier generations. Ed followed in his father's footsteps — As a Councilman, a member of the Planning and Zoning Commission, and later as the first public elected Mayor of Millington. Ed served multiple terms as Mayor throughout the years. He held the office for so many years that he earned induction into the Maryland Municipal League (MML) Hall of Fame, He also served as President of the MML and was a longtime member of its conference planning committee. He was also a member of the Association of the County Administrators. Ed's decades of leadership and community involvement were further recognized through his inclusion in *Who's Who of Maryland* and the book *Legendary Locals of Kent County*. Over time, Millington became known for its Robinsons, Noland, Carville, and Ed - a family deeply woven into the fabric of the town's civic life.

His community involvement included membership in the Moose and Lions Clubs (where he served as President), the American Legion, the Millington Community Fire Department, and Asbury United Methodist Church — where he was a devoted member for over 70 years and sang in the choir. He was also a proud member of the Galena High School Alumni Band, performing with the group until it dissolved in 1992. In his early years, Ed gave back in many other ways as well, serving as an assistant coach with Millington Little

League and staying active in the Boy Scouts.

Ed loved being on the Chesapeake Bay with his family, fishing, and cheering on his favorite sports teams — the Philadelphia Phillies and the Baltimore Ravens. He was also his children and grandchildren's biggest fan. He never missed a Queen Anne's County High School football game, proudly supporting his grandson from the sidelines, and after moving west, he continued to follow his grandson's high school football coaching career in Greybull, Wyoming. Ed was a constant presence throughout his grandchildren's lives — he never missed a school activity during their years of schooling, and as they became adults, he was always there with support, guidance, and love whenever they needed him.
