



Thomas F. Cahill, Jr.

December 21, 1938 - March 11, 2009

Thomas F. Cahill, Jr. died on Wednesday, March 11, 2009 at Anne Arundel Medical Center. He was 70 years old.

Thomas F. Cahill, Jr was born in 1938 in Morristown, NJ to the late, Thomas F. and Ruth Cahill. He graduated from Morristown High School in 1957. Mr. Cahill attended St. Francis College, Loretto, PA where he was a member of Tau Kappa Epsilon National Fraternity. He graduated from Fairleigh Dickenson University, Madison, NJ with a BA in Economics in 1963.

Mr. Cahill served in the New Jersey National Guard from 1961 until his honorable discharge in 1967 with the rank of Staff Sergeant.

He worked at Parsippany Building Supply from 1963-1965. In 1965, he began his 34 year career, working for the United States Gypsum Company (U.S.G. Corporation) and its subsidiary L & W Supply. He retired as Director of Operations in 2000.

Mr. Cahill was a member of St Christopher's Roman Catholic Church, Chester, MD where he was a 4th degree Knight in the Knights of Columbus. His hobbies included golf, fishing, basketball, tennis and gardening.

Surviving are his wife of 44 years, Dorothy; two daughters, Noreen A. Collins

of California and Erin M. Cahill of Maryland; one brother, John Cahill of Morris Plains, NJ; one sister, Ruth P. Sanzo of Manahawkin, NJ; and two grandchildren. One son, Thomas F. Cahill, III predeceased him.

A funeral mass will be held at 11 o'clock on Monday, March 16, 2009 at St. Christopher's Catholic Church in Chester, MD. Interment will be in Gate of Heaven Cemetery in East Hanover, NJ. Donations can be made to St Jude's Hospital Cancer Center for Children in lieu of flowers.
