



## Thursby Fairbanks Cooper Jr.

Thursby Fairbanks Cooper, Jr., departed this life on Monday, August 24, 2015, at the University of Maryland Shore Medical Center at Easton, MD.

Born on March 28, 1947, in Easton, he was the son of the late Thursby Fairbanks Cooper and Doris Ball Cooper.

Mr. Cooper was joined in Holy Matrimony to Katherine L. Quimby on August 23, 1971. Beside family, on August 23, 2015, they celebrated their blessed union of forty-four years by candle light, love, good food, and laughter.

Thursby graduated from St. Michaels High School and joined the United States Navy in 1965. A proud servant of God and country, he was an Aviation Electricians Mate 2nd Class and served until 1969. Following in family footsteps, he passionately joined the Maryland State Police Academy, in Pikesville, MD, where he attained the rank of Sergeant and served for twenty-five years.

Mr. Cooper was a member of Christ Church in St. Michaels, MD. He was a man of strong faith and love of his family. He was a proud member of the Maryland State Troopers Association. He enjoyed his time at Talbot County Hog Neck Golf Course, Big Al's, and his friendships he made during employment at Wal-Mart. Thursby could be found enjoying past times of

fishing, crabbing, gardening, cooking and baking, and spending time with his granddaughter, Fiona Jewels, and family.

In addition to his parents, Mr. Cooper is survived by his loving wife, Katherine Quimby Cooper, adoring daughter, Amanda Kay Cooper, apple of his eye granddaughter, Fiona Jewels Cooper; and a sister, Patricia Cooper Lomax. He was preceded in death by a son, Andrew Nelson Cooper.

“ Starting in 2003, when we first started spending every weekend in St. Michaels, Maryland, we quickly learned that the best thing about St. Michaels was Big Al's Seafood. Big Al's quickly earned a place on the speed-dial of my cell phone. When I was twenty minutes away, I would click that link and order a dozen of "The biggest crabs you've got" to pick up in twenty minutes.

The best thing about buying crabs from Big Al's was Thursby. He cooked up the crabs in the back. He would bring them out of the kitchen, wiping the dripping sweat from his forehead, and take a much-needed break from the heat of the kitchen to say hello. I had never met anyone with the first name of Thursby. It took me a while to remember. I finally locked it into my memory bank by telling myself, "I always order crabs on Friday, but he bought them yesterday, on Thursby." Of course, they were always caught fresh on Friday, but it helped me remember Thursby's southern name.

Thursby would tell us about the weather, the crab harvest, word from the boats, the size of the crabs, and when they would be at their fullest. Thursby knew something about everything, and was happy to share it. Thursby could hold up his end of a conversation and then some, but without ever talking too long. He knew the crabs were fresh and hot and you needed to get them home. He would tell you not to roll the top of the brown shopping bag closed, or they would keep cooking and get soft.

My favorite memory, among thousands, of Thursby was the day I called in for another dozen of their biggest crabs. When we got there, he came out of the kitchen, sweating profusely from the heat, and apologized that they would be twenty minutes late.

"I know you and your wife like extra large or jumbo crabs, and we ran out of them. So I sent the boss down to the docks to get you a dozen of the biggest ones he could find, and he just got back with them." When he brought them out, freshly steamed, he had an ear-to-ear smile and said, "I hope you enjoy these. I guarantee they're

*fresh and the biggest in town!" They were the best crabs ever. Knowing what Thursby and Big Al (or maybe it was 'Little Al', his son, that day) had gone through for our dozen crabs was better than all the Old Bay on the planet.*

*I work for a company that prides itself on stellar customer service. We don't sell crabs, but we would do well to attain the level of customer service that this man personified, whether in protecting our nation in the US Navy, or our state as a Maryland State Trooper, or cooking crabs for families to enjoy with their friends and families on a hot summer day.*

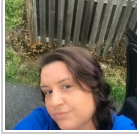
