



Timothy Sumner Parker

August 8, 1985 - September 28, 2024

After a long struggle with his mental health, Timothy left this earth on September 28, 2024, hopefully to find the peace in heaven he was unable to find in this life.

Timothy (Tim) Sumner Parker was born on August 8, 1985, in Gaithersburg, MD to Drs. Robert and Margaret Parker. He lived in Rockville, Maryland until age 5 when they moved to Setauket, New York. He attended the Three Village School District and received an Associates Degree from Suffolk Community College. Not fully embracing formal education, Tim apprenticed with a CIA-trained chef and worked in a series of local restaurants honing his skills and palate. In 2018, Tim moved with his parents to Easton, Maryland, where he worked as a chef at local restaurants until Covid struck. Tim was subsequently hired as a chef at Bayleigh Chase, a local retirement community. Tim is survived by his parents, his sister Jaime, his brothers, Robert, Jr. (Kim), Christopher (Sarah), and Matthew (Danielle), five nephews and nieces, numerous aunts, uncles and cousins (too numerous to count) and his 96-year-old grandfather.

Tim was a skilled chef, an accomplished hockey player and an avid mountain climber. His love of the mountains was nurtured from an early age as a camper at Camp Treetops in Lake Placid, New York, where he also spent many summers as a counselor and cook. Tim most recently scaled Lobuche and Pokalde peaks in the Himalayas in Nepal. Tim will be most remembered

for his love of animals, especially dogs, but in particular for his love of Mac, a rescue dog and his soulmate of 13 years, who passed away in February of this year. Tim will be missed for his tremendous heart and deep love of his family.

Tim's ashes will be spread at Hilltop in Dorchester, New Hampshire, a place that always gave him great joy.
