Todd Emmett Wiggins, was called into the loving arms of his Savior on May 1, 2018, following a courageous battle with ALS.

Todd was born on January 26, 1949, and spent his childhood in his beloved hometown of Bentleyville, PA. He was the son of the late Virgil and Zelda Wiggins.

Todd graduated from Bentleyville High School in 1967 and California State University in 1971. He moved to Maryland in 1973, where he began his career as a teacher. He energetically taught 7th grade World Geography for over 40 years at Magothy River Middle School in Arnold, MD. He joined the Army in 1971 and proudly served for over 20 years in the Maryland Army National Guard where he met his wife, Lynda. They were married in 1988.

He was called into the ministry in 1995 where he spend years serving as a Lay Leader until accepting the position of pastor at Wye Mills United Methodist Church, where he served passionately until ALS took his voice. He was an active community member, coaching his children's soccer and basketball teams. He was an avid athlete, enjoying tennis, golf, softball, biking and running. He continued to work out diligently even after ALS began to take his strength and movement. He enjoyed traveling to historic places and particularly enjoyed the nature and wildlife throughout the Eastern Shore of

Maryland, where he lived since 1984.

He is survived by his loving wife, Lynda, and children, Shane, Kevin and Kelly, sister, Lynn Dunham and her husband, Keith, in-laws, Estell Bouffard, Nancy and Gary Lines, Michael Bouffard, and William and Kim Bouffard and many loving nieces and nephews.

A Celebration of Life service will be held at 11 am on May 19th at Wye Mills UMC in Wye Mills, MD, where friends and family may visit on May 18 from 6-8 pm. Interment of ashes will held at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date.

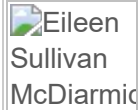
