June 24, 1966 - May 13, 2025

Trishia Peerman, 58, of Easton, MD died at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, MD on May 13, 2025.

Trishia was born in Lebanon, PA on June 24, 1966, the daughter of Theodore Linden Book, Sr. and Rita Fonderwhite Book. Trishia attended Brookville High School in Lynchburg, VA and then went to Averett University where she earned a degree in business. Trishia excelled in various business roles, during her career, at the Virginia Credit Union League and Media Management.

She married Phillip Douglas Peerman on October 22, 1994, and moved to Roanoke, Virginia for 5 years then relocated to Easton, MD where Trishia was a dedicated wife and mother raising her 2 children and being a best friend to her beloved Bichon Frisé, Dori. Trishia was a prayer warrior and always held others up in prayer when they were having trials. She was cherished by her church community where she was active in ministry, even in times of extreme health challenges. Trishia homeschooled her children until her health was impacted. She was very blessed with the gift of a single lung transplant in 2005 and again in 2011 which provided her almost 20 years of extra time with her family and friends. She was able to see both of her children graduate from college. Trishia gave back by mentoring others during their own transplant journey.

She loved playing piano and was also very talented in painting, knitting,

scrapbooking, quilting, basketweaving, genealogy and other arts and crafts.

She is survived by her husband of 30+ years, Phillip; son Phillip William Peerman; daughter Caitlin Douglas Peerman; her parents Theodore Linden Book, Sr. and Rita Fonderwhite Book; her sister Audra Lin Book; brother; Theodore Linden Book, Jr.; as well as 1 niece and 4 nephews, and the newest member of her family, Barbie, a Shichon rescue dog.

A celebration of life service will be held on June 21, 2025, at Real Life Chapel Church, 418 Glebe Road, Easton, MD 21601 at 2 PM.

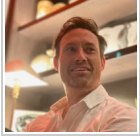

We prayed for Trish and her health challenges and were thrilled when she was able to get her lung transplants. Being aware of her health challenges I was reluctant to reach out to her when Meggan went through her own health difficulties. Not only did Trish not mind, she shared what she learned from her experience.

While the health conditions between Trish and Meggan were different, there were some lessons she learned that were extremely helpful for us. In fact, after we first told Trish about Meggan's first health crisis, I sensed that Trish began to 'watch out for us' and would check in with us once in a while. I also know that Trish prayed a lot for Meggan, myself and our kids. I will never know how much help we received through her prayers but praise be to God for prayer warriors like Trish.

Since we lived in Canada, far to the North of where Trish & Phillip live, we didn't get to see them often other than at church camps in North Carolina. On one trip down South, we arranged to get together with Trish & Phillip before camp. It may have only been for an hour or two but it filled us up with hope, peace and comfort. The more they shared from their journey, the more we realized we weren't alone through ours. We realized that although others like Trish have been through serious health conditions before Meggan, Trish & Phillip's attitude, perspective and faith boosted our own morale.

Much more recently Phillip and Trish were able to visit our local church in Stratford, Ontario, Canada. We had a wonderful visit with them there as well. These spiritual mentors have been such a blessing to my wife and I.

I have thanked them before but I wish I could thank Trish once more. I pray that God will bless her for her outlook on her own health journey and for sharing it with us. I am so glad that we knew

Trish and that we know Phillip. Their lives are a testimony to their walk with the Lord and for their love towards others. Thank you Trish & Phillip!
