Tudor Whiton of Easton, MD died on Thursday, January 27, 2005 at Memorial Hospital at Easton. He was 95.

Born October 14, 1909 in Washington, DC, he was the son of the late Harry Augustus and Emma Jane Case Whiton. Upon graduating from Central High School in 1927, he took a position with the First National Bank of Washington in 1929. He served in many positions and retired after forty-five years as Senior Vice President of Branch Administration and Leadership Development and then Retail Banking.

He was a graduate of Benjamin Franklin University and did graduate work in banking at George Washington University, American Institute of Banking, Stonier Graduate School of Banking, and Rutgers University.

In June 1938 he married the former Maude Hulick and they made their home in College Heights, MD until moving in 1993 to William Hill Manor in Easton. After sixty-five years of marriage, Maude passed away on March 15, 2004.

He was a member of the Riverdale Presbyterian Church, where he was a Past-Deacon and Past-Treasurer. He was a member of the Robert Morris Association and a Past-Treasurer of the National Republican Senatorial Campaign Committee. He was active in Boy Scouting and held various

committee posts in the D.C. Bankers Association including Chairmanship of the Auditors Section.

He is survived by a daughter, Ann W. Vass of Easton, a son, Alfred H. Whiton of Mountain Top, PA, four grandchildren and four great grandchildren. He was predeceased by one sister and two brothers.

Funeral services will be held on Saturday, February 12 at 11 a.m. at Fort Lincoln Cemetery Chapel in Bladensburg, MD. Burial will be at Fort Lincoln Cemetery.
