



Vernon Grayson Caldwell

April 2, 1917 - April 28, 2009

Vernon Grayson Caldwell, formerly of Hunt Valley, died on Tuesday, April 28, 2009 at Chesapeake Woods Center in Cambridge, MD. He was 92 years old.

Vernon was born on April 2, 1917 to the late Robert Caldwell and Loretta Helmling in Baltimore, MD. He grew up on Fulton Avenue in Baltimore City and was a graduate of PolyTech High School. He began working at Glen L. Martin with engineering and production. In late 1948 Vernon established Caldwell Casting in Baltimore City on Falls Road where he served the military. He relocated the business to Cambridge where he continued to operate and run the company until the present.

He enjoyed fishing, boating, and competition ballroom dancing. Vernon was an active member of the Cambridge Yacht Club where he served as Fleet Captain.
