Vincent DeSanctis of Tilghman, MD died on February 1, 2024, at the University of Maryland Medical Center, Easton, MD following a brief illness. Vince was born in Paterson, NJ on July 13, 1941, to Vincent and Helen (Ruocco) DeSanctis of Fair Lawn, NJ.

He attended school in NJ earning a bachelor's degree in history, master's degree in administration, and Doctor of Education in administration.

Vince married Francine (Barone) in 1967 and raised two children. A son Greg, with whom he shared a love of sports and a daughter Stephanie, with whom he shared a love of books.

An avid bird watcher Vince actively pursued this interest until his death and was a member of the Talbot County Bird Club. Vince also volunteered as an umpire for St. Michael's Little League and Election Judge and poll watcher in Talbot County. He also served on the Communicator Committee of the Talbot County Democratic Forum as a member and active letter writer on political issues.

A lifelong educator and advocate for community college education, Vince served as CEO of Penn State University Campus, Shenango Valley, PA and President of Warren County Community College until his retirement.

Vince is survived by his wife, Francine of 56 years, son Greg of NJ, daughter Stephanie (Stahler) and her husband Scott of MD, grandson Jack Stahler, sister Rosemary of FL, brothers Joseph of FL and Michael of MN, and several nieces and nephews.
