John always seemed more like a big brother to me than a cousin. He was the consummate nice guy, a gentle giant who was thoughtful, kind, caring, and a really sweet guy.

As a teenager, he was generous with his time. He taught me how to drive in his grandmother, Elizabeth's, car and even went with me to the D.M.V. when I took my test. He included me on a beach trip to Ocean City, Maryland with his Maryland City friends. I still remember riding in the backseat of his grandmother's 1970's Pontiac with rock and roll music playing loudly as we rolled down Route 50 to the beach. He stayed current on world and family events and always had time to carry on long conversations with a good listening ear. He never complained about himself as his mobility became an issue. He was always positive and sounded great. John was grateful that I was able to help arrange for he and Cherri to be included in the Queen Anne's County Senior Nutrition Program, who provided a nutritious meal everyday. He said that he enjoyed the meals. On our last conversation, he told me they were delivering a fresh ham dinner for Valentine's Day. He was always appreciative when I tried to help him with his Medicare and the sale of his West Virginia property.

I will deeply miss John, who was my friend. I know my sweet cousin has found Utopia in Heaven. His memory will live on through his family, friends, and the many people he touched in his life. God Bless.
