April 27, 1921 - April 18, 2011

Virginia M. Taylor of Easton passed away at The Pines on Monday, April 18, 2011. She was 89.

Born in Cordova on April 27, 1921, she was the daughter of the late Frederick C. and Geraldine Carstens Mueller. After graduating from Cordova High School in 1939, she attended the Ellis Sisters School of Beauty in Wilmington, DE. Following her graduation from the beauty school, she worked in several beauty shops in the Easton area.

She was a member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church and a life member and past president of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Easton Volunteer Fire Company. She was also a member of the Auxiliary of the Memorial Hospital at Easton, where she worked at the Commission Shop, and a volunteer of the Blood Bank of the Eastern Shore.
