



Walter Rudolph Fritz Bodack

March 13, 1930 - July 19, 2024

Walter Bodack, of Easton Maryland passed away peacefully in his home on July 19th after a courageous battle with cancer at the age of 94. Until the end he remained cheerful, engaged and optimistic, frequently communicating with family, friends and neighbors.

Walter was born in Saaz, Czechoslovakia, to Otto Bodack and Maria Schroll on March 13, 1930. The Bodack family suffered significant upheaval during World War II and settled in Georgundsmund, Germany at the end of the war. In Germany, Walter is survived by his loving siblings Hildegard and Horst (Bridget) and numerous nieces and nephews.

At the completion of his studies and the launching of his career in Europe and India, Walter moved to the United States in 1956 at the request of Daimler Benz to help launch Mercedes-Benz North America. While working at Mercedes, he met and fell in love with his secretary, Patricia Cryan. The two were married in 1957 and enjoyed a 67 year marriage. He leaves behind their seven children Elisabeth (Korey), Mark (Mary Ellen), Christa, Leigh (John), Michael, Neal (Carmela) and Maria (Brian). He was a proud grandfather to Bryan, Eric, David, Charlotte, Sophia, Alex, Nick, Tyler, Conner, Katie, Paul, Julia, Efi and Otto and great grandfather to Grace and Sara.

Walter spent his entire career in the automotive industry working for

Mercedes-Benz. He was one of the original 10 employees sent from Stuttgart to set up the distribution network for cars and trucks in North America. He climbed the corporate ladder while raising his large family on Long Island. He held numerous positions within the company and retired as President, Mercedes-Benz North America in 1988.

In retirement, he enjoyed many hobbies namely gardening, fishing and boating. He was an avid reader and especially enjoyed world history and classical music.

A big thank you to his health care team. We are profoundly grateful to his doctors, nurses and aids who made him comfortable in his final years.

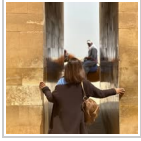
