



Walter Ellwood Thompson Sr.

September 12, 1928 - July 5, 2010

Walter Ellwood Thompson Sr. of Grasonville died surrounded by his family at home July 5, 2010. He was 81.

Born September 12, 1928 in Grasonville, the son of Herman S. Thompson and Mildred Jewell Thompson. He was a graduate of Stevensville High School, Class of 1945. After high school he began working as a mason for his father with Phillips and Thompson. On August 2, 1951 he married Peggy Gretzinger. He was drafted into the Army and served during the Korean War in Germany. After his discharge in 1953 he returned to Grasonville and continued working as a mason. Ellwood later owned and operated an oyster and clam house and later developed several businesses and developments which included Cedar Point Marina (now Lippincott) Family Acres Camp Ground (now Beach Harbor), and Oyster Cove Community. He had served on the Queen Anne's County Board of Appeals for 10 years, was a life member of the VFW #7464, the American Legion in Queenstown, and the Moose Lodge #1954 in Pine Island FL.

He is survived by his wife, Peggy L. Thompson of Grasonville, MD; two daughters, Deborah S. Whitby of Queenstown and Sandra L. Chapman and her husband, Steve of Ijamsville, MD; a son, Walter E. Thompson Jr. and his wife, Diane of Trappe MD; a sister, Catherine Alvarez of Chester, MD; ten grandchildren, Kelly Suzanne Anderson, Karen Nicole Marable, Tyler Philip
