January 19, 1937 - May 20, 2014

Wanda Athelene Thompson of Church Hill, MD, died on Tuesday, May 20, 2014, at University of Maryland Shore Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Chestertown. She was 77.

Born on January 17, 1937, in Sullivan, WV, she was the daughter of the late Joel James and Wanda Barker Carter. She graduated from Oxford Area High School, Class of 1956, and then moved to Church Hill, MD to help take care of her aunt. She married Leroy Smith Thompson of Millington, MD, who predeceased her in 2001. During her career, she worked for Mr. and Mrs. Goldstein at their five and dime store as a clerk. Later, Mrs. Thompson worked for Mr. Bonnett in his clothing store, "Fox's" as a clerk.

She was a member of the Liberty Light House Church in Chestertown, MD.

Mrs. Thompson is survived by a sister, Joann Worton of Dover, DE; and a niece, Tracy C. Carter of Centreville, MD.

She was predeceased by a daughter, Sharon Lee Thompson in 1987.
