Warren Eliot Davis, 79, of Chester, MD died at The Barnette Center on July 10, 2024.

Warren was born in Boston, MA on August 3, 1944, the son of the late William Davis and late Alice (Manson) Davis. Warren grew up in North Attleboro, MA and was one of six children. He moved to Maryland in 1964. He graduated from Mackin High School in Washington, DC and later in life earned his associate degree from Anne Arundel Community College for Business Management.

Warren retired from Pepco Electric Company in 2008 after working there for almost 30 years. He continued working part time at several different jobs around the Kent Island area, including Safeway, Papa Johns Pizza, Domino's Pizza, McDonalds and lastly Auto Plus. Warren was very hardworking and liked to keep busy. He also volunteered, for almost 40 years, at the Franciscan Monastery in Washington, DC as a Knight of Mount Saint Sepulcher. There he assisted with Mass services and gave tours of the Catacombs underneath the Monastery.
