Warren F. Phillips of Hurlock died on Tuesday, December 15, 2009 at the Memorial Hospital at Easton. He was 84.

Born in Chicago, IL on June 25, 1925 he was the son of the late, Charles Frederick and Mae Warren Phillips. Mr. Phillips worked as a controller for Easton Utilities for 35 years until his retirement on July 19, 1985. Following his retirement, Warren worked as a courier for Shore Health Labs for 13 years.

Warren was life member of the Easton Volunteer Fire Department for 59 years where he served as Chief from 1959-1960 and 1971- 1972 and was a past Trustee. He was recognized by the House and the Senate for his service in the fire department as well as the recipient of a Proclamation from the Town of Easton stating November 2002 as Warren F. Phillips month. Mr. Phillips was a Volunteer at Genesis Health Care, The Pines from 2003 - 2006. He was also a member of the Easton Church of God.

Mr. Phillips is survived by his beloved wife, Rev. Carol Ann Phillips, whom he married on June 10, 1977; three children; Nancy Wood of Easton, James Dean III of McDaniel, and Julianna Foust of Trappe; one sister; Annetta Warner of Sparrows Point, MD; seven grandchildren; Holly and Roger Ruby, John Andrew, Ashton Obitz, Mirissa Foust, David and Sara Dean; two great-grandchildren; Ryan Obitz, Jr and Teague Andrew. He is predeceased by one

daughter, Cathy Hall and one sister, Louise Walter.

A funeral service will be held at the Easton Church of God on Monday, December 21, 2009 at 12 noon where friends may call from 10 AM to 12 PM.

Burial will be at Woodlawn Memorial Park with full fireman's honors.
