Wayne David Wicker, 63, of Chester, MD died Monday, September 15, 2008 at Anne Arundel Medical Center, surrounded by his loving family.

Born in Philadelphia, PA, he was the son of Charles Louis and F. Esther (Daisy) Wicker. He was a resident of Chester, MD since 1979.

Mr. Wicker graduated from Bensalem High School near Philadelphia, and has attended several trade schools over the years. He worked in drafting and engineering for several companies near Philadelphia before moving with his family to Maryland.

He worked in the steel industry, supervising and installing materials, and construction of heating vessels in steel mills and other industry on the east coast and in the south.

Later he did vibration analysis for large motors and engines in large industry, and supervised the construction of wastewater treatment plants on the east coast.

Mr. Wicker was active in outboard boat racing in the C and D class and the Alcohol class outboards, and he built engines for inboard boat racers.

For many years he was a model railroad enthusiast, building and detailing his own equipment. He built and flew model airplanes and helicopters, as well as model rockets. He was the chief mechanic for his son's motorcycle racing, taking him to the national championships in 1989. He was an avid motorcyclist and rode with friends in various organized rides or just rode with a small group

of friends.

Mr. Wicker was well known for drinking beer and telling bad jokes.

He is survived by his wife Kathleen B. (Herring), one son, David Alan and his wife, Sandy, and two daughters, Jennifer Lynne and Margaret Catherine Chialastri and her husband, Dan. He was four grandchildren.

A memorial visitation will be held at his home, 108 Dundee Avenue, Chester, MD, on Saturday, September 20, 2008 from 12:00 pm to 6:00 pm.
