June 30, 1925 - December 2, 2014

Wildie E. "Bill" Todd, II, of Seaford, DE, formerly of Easton, MD, died at Methodist Manor on December 2, 2014. He was 89.

Born in Easton, MD, June 30, 1925, he was the son of the late James Bennett and Mary Ann Matthews Todd. He was raised by his grandparents and following the death of his grandfather, was adopted by his grandmother, Ruth Poole Todd. After graduating from Easton High School in 1943, he served in the U.S. Army in the European Theater of Operations. Following his release from active duty in 1946, he studied at The Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore until 1950. He then began his career in hotel and club management and worked in MD, FL, AZ, CA and NJ. He closed his career as office manager at The Talbot Country Club in Easton where he retired in 1988 with fourteen years of service.

A member of St. Marks United Methodist Church in Easton, he was a former member of Easton Elks Lodge # 1622 and Coats Lodge #102, AF & AM. Music was his hobby.

Bill, as he was best-known, is survived by three nieces, one nephew. and all of their children.

He was predeceased by his sister, Devra R. Bennung.

A graveside service will be held at Spring Hill Cemetery, Easton, on Friday, December 12, 2014, at 11:30am.
