Easton: William Robert Coleman of Easton, died on September 17, 2011. He was 91.

Born in Trappe, February 17, 1920, he was the son of the late William Henry and Clara Prettyman Coleman. After attending public School, he worked as an assistant caretaker in Miles River Neck area. He was then engaged in custom farming. In the 1940's, he and his father worked in heavy construction and custom farming. The company was dissolved in April of 1973. From 1974 until 1991, he was employed by the Town of Easton, first as at the Building, Zoning and Plumbing inspector and later as the special projects coordinator until his retirement in 1991. In the latter position, he had been involved in such projects as the Easton Neighborhood Center and the Easton police building.

A lifelong resident of Talbot County, he was a member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church, the Talbot Rod and Gun Club, the National Skeet Association, the Talbot County Farm Bureau, the ABC Contractors Association and the Easton Elks Lodge, where he had been a member since 1960. He was a collector and restorer of antique farm tractors and was a member of the Tuckahoe Steam and Gas Association and the Eastern Shore Threshermans Association.

Mr. Coleman served on the Talbot County Social Services Board from 1973 to 1974 and on the Talbot County Zoning Appeals Board from 1974 until 1984. His wife, the former Ruth Broll, whom he married on February 16, 1940, died

on May 9, 1999.

Mr. Coleman is survived by two nieces and 1 nephew: Kim Marks, Kevin Broll and Tammy Broll; two brothers-in-law: Charles Broll and Raymond Broll, both of Easton. Along with his parents, Mr. Coleman was predeceased by his sister, Emmalean Rebmann, of Easton.
