William Thomas Elliott, Jr., 72, of Easton, MD, died on Thursday, March 8, 2012, at the Talbot Hospice House. Mr. Elliott was born in Easton on August 28, 1939, son of the late William Thomas Elliott, Sr., and Doris Spencer Diehl.

He graduated from Easton High School in 1957 and served in the United States Marine Corps from 1958 until being honorably discharged in 1964. Mr. Elliott was employed for 24 years at Waverly Press where he was Vice President of Manufacturing. He was also employed as the Program Director for Peninsula Regional Medical Center in Salisbury for 12 years until his retirement. He was a member of the B.P.O.E. # 1622 in Easton, the Academy of the Arts, the Friday Morning Artist, TCVAC and Myrtle Beach Hack and Whack Club. He was a former member of the Easton Kiwanis Club.

He is survived by his loving wife of 50 years, Frances Venable Elliott, whom he married in 1961; three children, Traci L. Jordan of Easton, Richard R. Elliott and his wife Fernanda of Annapolis, and Kelly Gilmore and her husband Donald "Sam" of Parkton, MD; six grandchildren, Timothy Jordan, Tiffany Diamond, Taylor Jordan, Alexa Elliott, Haley Gilmore and Sydney Gilmore; a sister, Joni Taylor of Wilmington, DE; and five nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by a brother, Glenn Diehl.
