William Farberman, 87, of Easton, MD, died on Wednesday, January 10, at his home. He was born in May of 1925 in Dolhinow, Poland. Mr. Farberman immigrated with his mother and two sisters to the United States in 1928. His father immigrated first just after William's birth. Mr. Farberman proudly became a citizen of the United States in 1943.

Mr. Farberman was a New York City Police officer from 1948 - 1968. Among his assignments were the 1964 World's Fair and Shea Stadium appearances by the Pope and The Beatles. Following his police retirement, Mr. Farberman enjoyed a successful career as a national sales representative for an apparel manufacturer.

Mr. Farberman was predeceased by his wife, Joan, this past November. They met as New York City Police officers. He will be lovingly remembered by his son, Daniel, and daughter-in-law, Deborah, of Geneseo, NY; daughter, Rhea and her spouse, Jan of Crofton, MD; and daughter, Valerie of Little Neck, New York. One of the great joys of Mr. Farberman's retirement was his grandchildren, Teri Finn and her husband Matt; Joseph Martello and his wife Yu-en, Mary Dempsey, and Kelly Sparks. He was thrilled by the birth of a great-grandchild, Samuel Martello in 2011. He will also be remembered by numerous loving nieces, nephews and friends.

Mr. Farberman was a founding member of The Port Jewish Center in Port Washington, NY, and served as its first president. During his term the Temple employed one of the first female rabbis to lead a congregation in the US. After moving to Easton, he became long-time member of Temple B'nai Israel and served on its Board of Directors. He was also a member of the Talbot Association of Clergy and Laity and the Talbot County Liquor Board.

A graveside service will be held on Sunday, January 13 at 12 p.m. at the Oxford Cemetery, Oxford, MD. The family will be observing Shiva at 5:30 p.m. on Sunday at the Temple - 101 W. Earle Ave, Easton.
