PRESTON: William M. Pinder of Preston died at the Memorial Hospital in Easton on Tuesday, March 17, 2009. He was 76.

Born in Talbot County on November 25, 1932, he was the son of the late, Ernest and Nellie May Chance Pinder. After attending public school, he worked for many years in construction. Since 1991 and up until the time of his death, he has worked for the Easton Police Department as a crossing guard at Dutchmans Lane and Aurora Street. He also enjoyed cutting grass for his long time customers, having cook-outs and spending time with his family. You could always see him riding his scooter through the town of Easton and he liked to hang out with his special friends at Chance's Store and Hardees in Easton.
