



## William Carney Powell

March 7, 1933 - July 27, 2018

William Carney Powell, Jr., of Chestertown, MD, died on July 27, 2018, at Heron Point in Chestertown. He was 85.

He was born in Norfolk, VA, on March 7, 1933, the son of the late William Carney Powell, Sr., and Virginia Boush Powell.

He was a graduate of Oceana High School in Oceana, VA, in 1952 and proudly served from 1953 until 1957 with the U.S. Coast Guard. He finished at Atlantic Christian College, with pre-engineering in Wilson, NC. His first marriage to Barbra Norryce ended in divorce. His second marriage to Nancy Hoon lasted over 40 years.

Mr. Powell had an enriching career which he began after he completed a 2 ½ year program at Capitol Radio Institute. He worked briefly with CBS and spent the majority of his career with NBC. Mr. Powell was instrumental in the conversion from film to video and soon became a cameraman and technical director at NBC News. He would then join as a member of the White House Press Corps and would frequently travel on Air Force One.

Mr. Powell covered world events, political conventions, presidential assassination attempts, and great tragedies along with tiresome hearings press conferences and stakeouts. He was at NBC for 25 years during the

Kennedy through George H.W. Bush administrations. Following retirement, he would freelance with NBC and CBS.

His wife, Nancy, brought out the adventurous side of him, they brought a small cabin in Lost River, WV, and became deeply involved in the area. He attended blue grass festivals, taught TV production at 4-H camp, joined the Lost River Artisans Cooperative, and worked tirelessly at the Lost River Museum.

He also enjoyed hiking, cooking, extensive travel, cherished pets, and tending to their garden.

In addition to his wife, Nancy Hoon Powell, he is survived by his daughter Suzanne Powell Ikenberry and her husband Steve of Spotsylvania, VA; grandchildren, Wesley Steven Ikenberry and Corey David Ikenberry; a sister, Anne Powell Lang; a brother, Robert Lee Powell; and a sister-in-law, Margaret Hoon Baker.

A celebration of his life will be held on Saturday, September 8, 2018, at 2:00 PM, at Wesley Hall, Heron Point 501 E. Campus Ave., Chestertown, MD.

*Bill and my late husband, Richard T. Slade ("Dick") were employed at NBC during the same period of time. During those NBC years Dick and I became friends with Bill and his wonderful wife Nancy. Bill and Dick retired from NBC about the same time. Bill went on to freelance as a cameraman and director. Dick and I had formed an independent production company in 1979, and upon retirement from NBC, he and I contributed full-time to produce a number of award-winning, visual communication tools for extremely diverse and discerning clients, as well as independent productions for sale to special interest groups.*
