William J. Scarborough, of Easton, MD, died January 2, 2013, at Talbot Hospice House. He was 90.

Born July 2, 1922, in Scranton, PA, he entered Penn State University and graduated in Mechanical Engineering in 1944. He joined the Navy and served aboard the aircraft carrier, U.S.S. Hornet as a lieutenant during World War II.

After being discharged, he married Marie Geisse. They had two children, a daughter, Lynn Marie, and a son, William Scarborough, Jr.

Bill was employed by E.I. Dupont Co. for 35 years. He retired and moved to Martingham in St. Michaels, MD, in 1981.

After Marie's death, he married Jacqueline Conner. They built a house in Cooke's Hope and resided there for 14 years.

Sailing was his favorite pastime, followed by golf and tennis.

He was a member of the Men's Thursday Morning Breakfast Club, Poplar Island Yacht Club, and the Talbot Country Club. He was active in the U.S. Sail and Power Squadron when he taught sailing and piloting courses for 10 years. Bill enjoyed his children, four grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren, as well

as his twin brother's family.
