



William Theodore Schwaninger

May 11, 1921 - April 24, 2013

William Theodore “Tiny” Schwaninger, 91, of Trappe, MD, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, April 24, 2013, at the Peace River Heart Institute in Port Charlotte, FL, after a lengthy illness. Mr. Schwaninger was born in Easton on May 11, 1921. He was the son of the late Theodore C. Schwaninger and Helen L. Gorsuch Schwaninger.

He was a farmer in Trappe until 1958 when he went to work in the Food Fair in Talbottown for five years. He was employed full-time for twenty years and part-time until he was eighty years old with the MD Department of Agriculture, as a State Poultry Grader/Inspector. He enjoyed wintering in Arcadia, FL, where he had his second home for 30 years. He was a member of the Easton Church of the Brethren since the age of thirteen.

Mr. Schwaninger is survived by his wife of 71 years, the former Marion “Doris” Jones Schwaninger, whom he married in 1941; a daughter, Marion “Lynn” Schwaninger Butler of Port Charlotte, FL; a son, T. Ted Schwaninger (Patty) of Trappe; and five grandchildren. He was preceded in death by three sisters, Irene Mullikin, Rebecca S. Swann, and Mary S. Warner.

A visitation will be held on Sunday, May 5, 2013 from 3 to 5 p.m. at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., 200 S. Harrison St. in Easton. A funeral service will be held on Monday, May 6, 2013, at 11 a.m. at the funeral

home. Interment will follow in Whitemarsh Cemetery on Rt. 50 in Trappe.

He made the world a better place for me growing up. And I will always be thankful for that.
