William Curtis Saunders, 70, died Saturday, February 21, 2010 at the La Casa Assisted Living home following an extended illness.

He leaves behind his devoted wife of 52 years, Jacquelyn Saunders; his son, Gregory Saunders and his wife; his son, Scott Saunders and his wife; his mother, Inga Lee Saunders; his brother, Edward Saunders and his wife and children; his brother, Alfred Saunders and his children; four grandchildren; and many close friends.

Born in Washington D.C. and raised in Maryland, the son of William R. and Inga L. Saunders, he was a lifelong resident of Maryland, most recently on the Eastern Shore.

In his early years, Mr. Saunders worked for the family's electrical contracting firm before forming his own company, Town Center Building Company. Later in his construction career, he co-founded Brookfield Builders, Inc., which he grew into one of Maryland's largest building companies at the time. During these years, he received his private pilot's license, a commercial marine captain's license and traveled quite extensively throughout the Country as well as abroad.

Upon retirement, Mr. Saunders enjoyed traveling, woodworking, metal

crafting, working on hot rods, leaded glass work and a myriad of other hobbies that caught his interest. His workshop was truly his pride and joy and he deeply enjoyed the time he spent in it with his family, friends, and visitors.

A memorial service will be held March 20th at 11 am at the Old Wye Church in Wye Mills, MD.
