



William Leonard Hoxter

March 31, 1922 - May 19, 2010

"Capt. Bill" William Leonard Hoxter of Stevensville, MD died on Thursday, May 19, 2010 at his home. He was 88 years old.

Born on March 31, 1922 in Baltimore, MD, he was the son of the late Ellen Elizabeth Livingston and Thomas Leonard Hoxter. Mr. Hoxter grew up in Chester, MD and attended school at Stevensville High. In 1941, he married Catherine Skinner who predeceased him in 1984. In 1942, Mr. Hoxter was drafted into the US Army. He served in the invasion of Normandy and was assigned to the 60th 3rd Tank Destroyer Battalion under General Patton. He received a Bronze Star and five major battle stars. After returning from WWII, he worked as a waterman. In 1950, Mr. Hoxter began working as a charter boat captain of "The Lady Ester" and later the "Vagabond". He retired in 1988. In 2004, his second wife, Miriam Geneva Hoxter, predeceased him. He was a member of the Grasonville VFW Post 7464, former member of the Knights of Pythias of Grasonville and the Stevensville Elks Lodge.

Mr. Hoxter is survived by a son, Jerry Hoxter of Chester, MD; two grandchildren, Clinton Hoxter of Pittsville, MD and Janet Rodgers of Georgia; a brother, Stewart Hoxter; a sister, Eunice Tolson of Chester, MD and a great-granddaughter, Sara Hoxter. He was preceded in death by a daughter, Judie Esther Hoxter.

A visitation will be held on Monday, May 24 from 2 to 4pm and 6 to 8pm at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., 106 Shamrock Road, Chester, MD 21619 where a funeral service will be held on Tuesday, May 25 at 11am.
