



## W. Radcliffe Soulsman

W. Radcliffe Soulsman of Bel Air, MD, formerly of Easton, died at his home on Sunday, February 10, 2002. He was 86.

Born January 3, 1916 in Ferry Neck, Talbot County, he was the son of the late Walter and Louise Fairbank Radcliffe Soulsman. He graduated from St. Michaels High School in 1933. During World War II he served in the 29th Division, 175th Infantry. Staff Sgt. Soulsman landed on D-Day minus one. He served four years in the service and was wounded and hospitalized for 18 months, received a Bronze Star and the Purple Heart. After his release from active duty, he returned to Talbot County where he was farm manager of Mulberry Hill and Gallaway Farms for 40 years for the late Louis M. Plansoen.

A member of First Baptist Church of Easton, he had served as Deacon, Trustee, Sunday School Teacher and Usher of the church.

Mr. Soulsman is survived by his wife of sixty years, the former Margaret E. Schwaninger, whom he married January 3, 1942; a son, Gary R. Soulsman of Wilmington, DE; a daughter, Marcia R. Soulsman of Bel Air, MD; two sisters, Mildred Warren of Felton, DE and Marcia Chaffinch of Horne Lake, Mississippi. He was predeceased by a brother, Albert Soulsman and a sister, Grace O'Day.

Funeral services will be held on Friday, February 15, 2002 at 2:00 PM at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., Easton, where friends may call one hour prior to the service.

Burial will be at Spring Hill Cemetery, Easton, MD.
