



## Yvonne Rust

May 7, 1929 - May 11, 2008

Yvonne P. Rust of Easton, MD, formerly of Pottersville, NJ, died at her home on Sunday, May 11, 2008. She was 79.

Born May 7, 1929 in Westfield, NJ, she was the daughter of the late Gilbert and Ruth Murphy Passavant. She was a 1949 graduate of Marjorie Webster College in Washington, D.C.

The most enjoyable times of her life were spent with her family on the beach in Emerald Isle, NC with children and grandchildren; skiing in Europe and the American West; sailing trips to Turkey and the Chesapeake Bay, and times spent with her husband in Africa and Europe, and rafting the Colorado River.

She served for many years in New Jersey at the Far Hills Country Day School, the Matheny School as a volunteer for handicap children and the Fresh Air Fund. In Maryland she was a volunteer for Talbot Hospice Foundation since 1981, on the Board at the Easton Day Care Center, and a founding member of the Talbot County Special Riders for over 25 years.

Mrs. Rust is survived by her husband of 58 years, Paul D. Rust; five children, Paul D. Rust IV and his wife Kathryn of Stockton, NJ, Holladay Bank and her husband Raymond of Butler, MD, Bonner English of Easton, MD, formerly of Hobe Sound, FL, David Rust of Cambridge, MD, and Sarah Mackenzie and

her husband Dave of Easton, MD; and nine grandchildren. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her sister, Suzanne Jacobus.
